

The Dairy Beef Index (DBI) A tool to rank beef bulls for the dairy herd

What is the Dairy Beef Index?

The Dairy Beef Index (DBI) is a breeding goal for Irish beef and dairy farmers to promote high-quality beef cattle bred from the dairy herd. The aim of the Dairy Beef Index is to allow dairy farmers to easily identify beef bulls that are **short gestation**, **easy calving**, **with a high carcass merit**.

Why was the DBI developed?


As a result of selecting beef bulls for mating on the dairy herd which are easy calving and short gestation only, the carcass attributes of dairy-beef cattle are at risk. That said, until now, it has not been easy to identify beef bulls for use in the dairy herd with desirable calving and carcass attributes; the Dairy Beef Index was developed to fill that void.

How is the DBI constructed?

The Dairy Beef Index is divided equally into two suites of traits, calving traits (i.e. easy calving, short gestation, less calf mortality) tailored specifically for the dairy farmer and beef traits tailored to deliver desirable attributes for the rearer and finisher (i.e., high carcass merit, docile etc.).

How do I interpret the DBI?

The Dairy Beef Index is expressed in euros (€), with higher euro values associated with better ranked bulls on the Dairy Beef Index. For example, a bull with a Dairy Beef Index value of €100 is expected to generate progeny that return €80 more revenue than a bull with a Dairy Beef Index value of €20; that additional €80 revenue is attributable to benefits gained through ease of calving, shorter gestation, less feed consumed, and improved carcass merit etc. Note: that €80 advantage is not totally derived from factory gate prices.



Where can I find the DBI?

The Dairy Beef Index is available on the ICBF website (www.icbf.com) through the Animal Search tool. Alternatively, users of the ICBF website can click on "Active Bull Lists" to identify beef Al bulls that currently rank best to worst on the Dairy Beef Index. Many Al companies also present the Dairy-Beef Index on their Al catalogues. All pedigree animals, including stock bulls and Al bulls have a DBI available.
